





BVSD Transportation Mission as the Basis for SRTS Collaboration



The Transportation Department's **MISSION** is: To transport every eligible student to and from school and school activities in the **Safest** manner possible, providing clean, **Safe**, friendly, on-time, equitable and efficient service all year.

Obstacles to Providing Safe, On-Time and Efficient Transportation: Safety

- Parents frantic to get to work drive erratically
- Parents distracted by their cell phones aren't paying attention
- Children let out on the opposite side of street have to cross against school traffic
- Children getting out on the wrong side of car run between cars that may exit suddenly

Obstacles to Providing On-Time and Efficient Transportation:

- Cars queue in front of schools. At many schools, buses have to wait in the queue to drop off and pick up.
- Parents often park in school bus drop off zone delaying drop-off
- Mixing cars and buses makes for dangerous situations that demand bus driver awareness
- Many buses travel with empty seats

Other Opportunities

- Ramped up interest in student fitness and concern about childhood obesity is pushing schools to find ways to include more physical activity without raising costs.
- The District has an interest in being seen by city and county government as a willing partner in reducing traffic in our communities.
