



## The Story of Safe Routes to Libraries





- Libraries have been doing this work for a long time!
- 2019 Safe Routes to Parks project with Central Arkansas Library System (Little Rock, AR)
- 2022 Librarians presented at Safe Routes to School Virtual Summit
- 2022-2024 Researched libraries and transportation projects, explored funding opportunities



### Safe Routes to Libraries Today

- 2024 Awarded a Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) planning grant
- Lead Agency Urban Libraries Council (ULC)
- 2025 Create a Safe Routes to Libraries framework to increase safety, accessibility, and physical activity around public libraries


